Pedro Freyre and Augusto Maxwell Remain Go-To National Media Sources on U.S.-Cuba Policy Shifts

International Practice Chair <u>Pedro Freyre</u> and Cuba Practice Chair <u>Augusto Maxwell</u> provided national media with leading insights on the White House decision to end decades of U.S.-Cuba immigration policy known as "wet foot, dry foot," which offered Cubans reaching U.S. land with a streamlined pathway to permanent residency.
