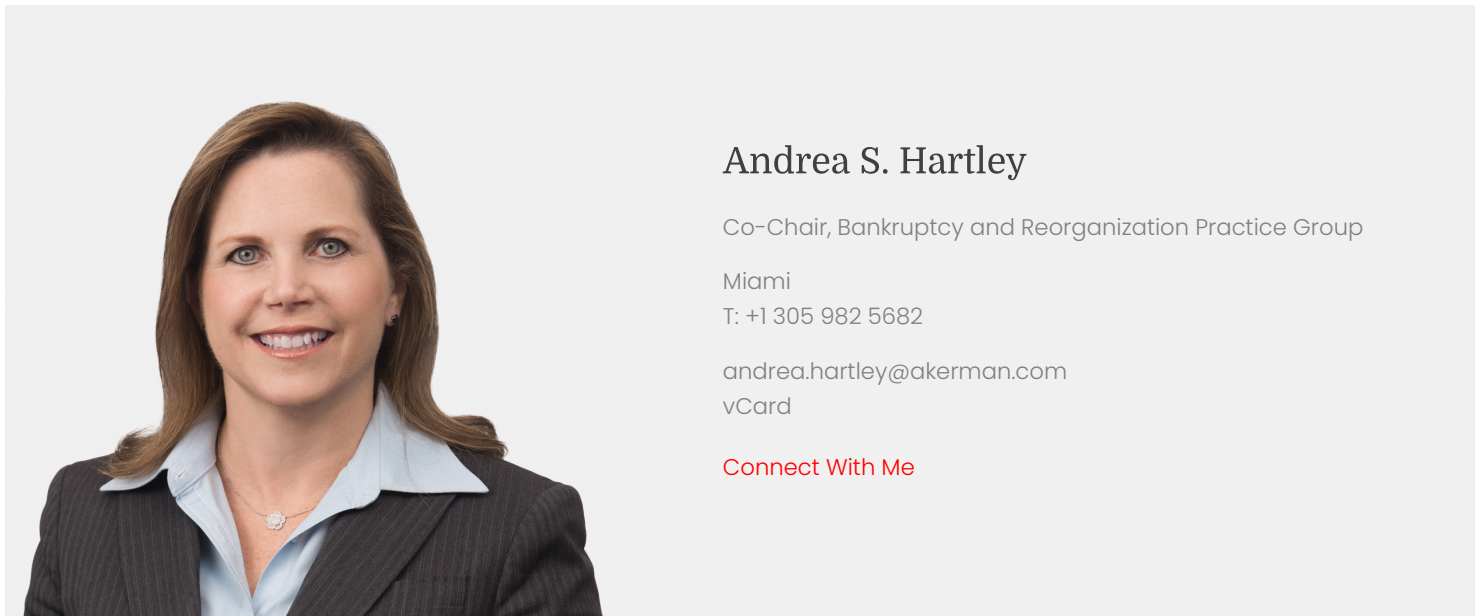

An experienced bankruptcy and creditors' rights litigator, Andrea counsels clients in the financial services, real estate, hospitality, restaurant, healthcare, and retail sectors on business reorganizations and liquidations, assumption and rejection of leases/contracts, workouts, debt restructurings, assignments for the benefit of creditors, and creditors' rights. She also has substantial experience with fraudulent conveyance and preferential transfer litigation. She acts on behalf of corporate debtors, committees, lenders, secured and unsecured creditors, commercial landlords, suppliers, vendors, and purchasers of troubled companies and their assets, both in and out of bankruptcy court.

She is also the past Chair of the ABA Women Rainmakers and a Fellow of the ABA. Andrea also served as only the third female president of the Dade County Bar Association in its then 95-year history.

Notable Work

Republic Metals Corporation and its affiliated debtors: Represented Republic Metals Corporation, one of the largest refiners of gold, silver, and precious metals in North America, and its seven wholly owned affiliates in its Chapter 11 case in the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of New York. The restructuring included negotiations and workouts with eight of the world's largest precious metals lenders collectively holding over \$200 million in secured debt and metal lease lines. After completion of a 363 sale of the company's assets to a Japanese competitor, the balance of the case revolved around complex litigation from leading metal suppliers and
