# Grasford Smith Elected Vice President of the National Bar Association

Grasford W. Smith, a litigation partner in Akerman's West Palm Beach office, has been elected vice president of the National Bar Association (NBA). He will serve for a two-year term effective August 1, 2025.

Founded in 1925, the NBA is the nation's oldest and largest national association of predominantly Black American lawyers, judges, law professors, and law students, with a network of over 67,000. It works to advance the science of jurisprudence, uphold the honor of the legal profession, promote collaboration among members of the American Bar, and protect the civil and political rights of all citizens.

Grasford has demonstrated steadfast commitment to the NBA for more than a decade through a wide range of leadership roles. He just completed a five-year term as chair of the Minority Partners in Majority Law Firms Division, where he has successfully expanded membership, increased programming, and enhanced the Division's national presence.
