Michael Goldberg Featured in *The Boston Globe* as Receiver in Complex EB-5 Fraud Case

Michael Goldberg, co-chair of Akerman's Fraud & Recovery Practice Group, was featured in *The Boston Globe* article titled, "Vermont's \$200 Million Mountain of Trouble." The article detailed the complex EB-5 fraud case involving the New England ski resort Jay Peak and highlighted Goldberg's role as court-appointed receiver.
