National Media Discuss U.S.-Cuba Trade Developments with Pedro Freyre, Augusto Maxwell

As trade between the United States and Cuba opens, national media discussed the implications behind such policy changes with Akerman's International Practice Chair [Pedro Freyre](#) and Cuba Practice Chair [Augusto Maxwell](#). Coverage appeared in *The Associated Press*, *Miami Herald*, *Politico*, *Reuters*, *USA Today* and *WLRN*, among others. Freyre and Maxwell told reporters that the new import rules allow independent Cuban entrepreneurs and cooperatives to export certain goods and services to the United States. They also noted the move would help private-sector growth across the island nation, especially since American companies may now buy services provided by Cuban entrepreneurs.
