National Media Seeks Pedro Freyre's Analysis of New Cuba Travel Restrictions

Multiple national news outlets spoke to International Practice Chair [Pedro Freyre](#) about the Trump Administration's newly imposed travel restrictions to Cuba. The ban specifically targets cruise lines travelling to the island nation.

“That sub-category of travel has been eliminated, but there is a grandfathering provision that basically allows US travelers that have, for example, booked a flight or booked rooms and were contemplating doing a people-to-people trip, they are allowed to complete it,” Freyre told *CNN*. “But that doesn't align with shutting down the ability of the cruises to go in.”
