Be open and unafraid of sharing yourself with others in your professional life. This is advice that I must give myself at times when I find myself hesitant to reference my husband when speaking with others. People in opposite-gender relationships are not typically hesitant to note that they went with their wife or husband to a certain restaurant or on a vacation, so why should LGBTQ people be afraid to do so?
